

About the Taluk Report Cards

The publication of the report of "High Power Committee for Redressal of Regional Imbalances" popularly known as Dr. D M Nanjundappa Committee Report has generated a good deal of debate on understanding regional imbalances as well as making efforts in correcting such imbalances in the state of Karnataka. The Committee in its voluminous report tried to figure out the development status of taluks in Karnataka state. Using an array of indicators the Committee developed a Comprehensive Composite Development Index (CCDI) and Cumulative Deprivation Index (CDI) for each taluk and compared the value of CCDI of each taluk against that of the state to arrive at the comparative position of different taluks for the year 2000. The CCDI of Dr. D M Nanjundappa Committee in the present day context can be used as a bench mark to examine what has happened among the taluks as far as similar index is concerned. In this background CMDR attempted construction of similar index using similar methodology and database for the period 2009-10.

After the report was submitted various governments in the state made efforts in correcting the regional imbalances as per the recommendations of Dr. D M Nanjundappa Committee. In the recent past, under the banner of Special Development Plan (SDP), the Government of Karnataka has been providing resources in tune with the recommendations of the Dr. D M Nanjundappa Committee across the state with an intention to reduce regional imbalances.

The present report cards as developed by CMDR make a modest attempt to present the comparative development scenario of taluks in each district. The comparison is made between Dr. D M Nanjundappa Index and the Index as developed by CMDR. The Report Cards contain at the outset the comparative positions of CCDI for two periods of time followed by the resource position.

The report cards basically address the policy makers and administrators for whom user friendly graphical presentations followed by cryptic notes are presented. Such report cards would come out for each district and presented as per the administrative divisions in the state.

We hope and trust that these report cards would be useful in taking further the issue of reducing regional imbalances in the state at large.

About Indicators and Methodology

Using 35 indicators - covering sectors viz., Agricultural and allied (9); Industrial Trade and Finance (5); Economic Infrastructure (9); Social Infrastructure (7); and Population Characteristics (5); Sector wise index for each of the 175 taluks by using a methodology which assigns a precise weight to each of these indicators. These 5 sectoral indices are then aggregated into a CCDI by using the shares of these 5 sectors (suitably adjusted by giving a 10 percent additional weightage to social infrastructure) in the SDP of Karnataka.

Considering that an index of '1' indicates the state average, the Committee was able to identify 114 taluks whose CCDI values were less than '1' as "Backward Taluks". The Committee further sub- divided these into:

- (i) Relatively developed taluks CCDI >1.
- (ii) Backward taluks: 0.88 < CCDI < 1;
- (iii) More backward taluks: 0.79 < CCDI < 0.89;
- (iv) Most backward taluks 0.52 < CCDI < 0.80;

(HPCFRRI, 2002, pp 906)



Overall District Scenario:

- ➤ According to Dr. D M Nanjundappa Committee Report, Tiptur and Tumkur were categorized as developed taluks.
- ➤ In 2009-10 Index, Tiptur, Turuvekere and Tumkur were categorized as developed taluks.
- ➤ All taluks of the district have registered positive change in index values, over a period of one decade.
- Madhugiri exhibits highest increase (70.12 per cent) followed by Tiptur and Gubbi.
- ➤ While two taluks (Tiptur and Tumkur) continue to remain as developed taluk after a decade, eight taluks have improved their category position compared to their earlier category.



Agriculture and Allied Sector

- ➤ Dr. D M Nanjundappa Committee identified Koratagere as the only developed taluk in the district.
- ➤ In 2009-10 Index, Turuvekere, Tiptur, Gubbi, C.N. Halli and Tumkur were identified as developed taluks.
- Except Kunigal, all nine taluks of Tumkur district have experienced positive change in the value of index, during the period 1999-00 to 2009-10. Maximum positive change is seen in Turuvekere (44.83 per cent) and maximum negative change is found in Kunigal taluk (-6.18).
- ➤ Seven taluks have improved their category, two taluks (Pavagda and Tumkur) have remained in same category and one taluk (Kunigal) has slipped down in the development ladder over a period of one decade.



Industry, Trade and Finance Sector

- As per Dr. D. M. Nanjundappa Committee Report, Tiptur and Tumkur were categorized as developed taluks.
- ➤ In 2009-10 Index, Madhugiri, Turuvekere, Kunigal, Tiptur and Tumkur were recognized as developed taluks.
- All taluks have experienced positive change in the value of index, with highest growth found in Madhugiri taluk (126.54 per cent) followed by Tiptur and Turuvekere.
- Except C.N.Halli (which continues to remain in more backward category), all other taluks have improved their category positions during the period 1999-00 to 2009-10.



Economic Infrastructure Sector

- As per Dr. D. M. Nanjundappa Committee Report, Turuvekere, Tiptur and Tumkur were categorized as developed taluks.
- ➤ In 2009-10 Index, Gubbi, Madhugiri, Turuvekere, Tiptur and Tumkur were identified in developed taluks category.
- Four taluks have experienced positive change and six taluks have experienced negative change in the value of index over a period of ten years. Gubbi registered highest (37.02 per cent) and Koratagere experienced lowest (-20.62 per cent) change during the study period.
- > Two taluks (Gubbi and Madhugiri) have improved their category positions, four taluks have remained in the same category and two taluks (Sira and Koratagere) have slipped down in their category positions over a period of time.



Social Infrastructure Sector

- As per Dr. D. M. Nanjundappa Committee Report, only Tumkur taluk was classified as developed taluk.
- ➤ In 2009-10 Index, except Gubbi, C.N.Halli and Kunigal, all ther seven taluks were found to be in developed taluks category.
- ➤ All taluks have experienced positive change in the value of index over a period of one decade. Maximum increase in index value is found in Madhugiri (107.80 per cent), followed by Pavagada and Sira.
- > Six taluks show the improvisation in category positions, while four taluks remain in the same category after a gap of ten years.



Population Characteristics Index:


- As per Dr. D. M. Nanjundappa Committee Report, only Tumkur and Pavagada were identified as developed taluks.
- ➤ In 2009-10 Index, Kunigal, Tiptur and Tumkur were found to be in developed category.
- ➤ Koratagere, Sira, Madhugiri and Pavagada have experienced negative growth in the index value over a period of time. Kunigal registered maximum increase (68.29 per cent) during the reference years.
- ➤ Over a period of one decade, five taluks show improvement in the category positions, two taluks (Tumkur and Koratagere) remain in same category, while three taluks (Sira, Madhugiri and Pavagada) slipped down to lower category.


- As per Dr. D. M. Nanjundappa Committee Report, none amog the ten taluks were found to be in the list of developed taluks.

- Five taluks have experienced positive change and other five taluks have shown negative change in the value of index during the period 1999-00 to 2009-10.
- ➤ Tiptur taluk has experienced maximum increase (10.97 per cent) and Koratagere taluk has experienced maximum decline (-7.32 per cent).










































