The significance of the day emphasizes that environmental protection is not the responsibility of governments alone, it requires participation from every individual. It also bridges science, policy, and culture, encouraging communities to integrate ecological responsibility into daily life. In essence, World Environment Day is both a celebration and a responsibility, a reminder that the Earth is our shared home, and its care is a collective duty.

World Environment Day is a global call to act decisively on climate change, inspired by nature’s resilience and wisdom. It urged communities worldwide to integrate ecological responsibility into everyday life, aligning perfectly with CMDR’s initiative of planting Bilwa (Aegle marmelos) saplings in CMDR Dharwad campus. Bilwa or Bael, scientifically known as Aegle marmelos, is a mid-sized deciduous tree belonging to the Rutaceae family. It is regarded as one of the most sacred trees in the Shaivite tradition, often called the “Tree of Enlightenment” or the “Golden Apple.” The tree is easily recognized by its thorny branches and unique three-leaf cluster, in which one stem carries three leaflets, a feature that holds deep symbolic meaning. Known by many names such as Bael, Wood Apple, Golden Apple, Sriparni, and Sandilya, the Bilwa tree is deeply respected across India for its spiritual importance, healing qualities, and rich cultural heritage.

Bilwa is highly significant in both medicine and Hindu traditions. The plant is rich in compounds of medicinal importance. The fruit pulp contains substances that help improve digestion, while the leaves contain natural oils that help fight bacteria and fungal infections. The leaves also contain helpful compounds that support healthy blood sugar and cholesterol levels. Additionally, the leaves are used to treat diarrhea and other stomach ailments. Beyond its medicinal value, the Bilwa tree also supports the environment by releasing oxygen and absorbing harmful air pollutants, helping to keep the air cleaner and the surroundings healthier. On the other hand, it is of religious importance in the worship of Lord Shiva.

The Director, Registrar, all teaching and non-teaching staff of CMDR participated in the event.

World Environment Day 2026

- ❖ World Environment Day is celebrated every year on 5th June as the United Nations’ principal platform for encouraging global awareness and action to protect our environment. Established in 1972 during The Stockholm Conference on the Human Environment, it has grown into one of the largest global observances, engaging governments, organizations, communities, and individuals in collective efforts to safeguard the planet. The purpose of world environment day is to raise awareness about pressing environmental issues such as climate change, deforestation, pollution, and biodiversity loss.

Each year, the UN announces a theme focusing on a specific environmental challenge (for example, the theme of 2026 was “Inspired by Nature, For Climate, For Our Future.” emphasizing the link between climate action and nature-based solutions. Prof. Anand Thakur, Professor, Department of Financial Administration, School of Management, Associate Dean Students' Welfare, Central University Of Punjab, Ghudda, Bathinda (Punjab) delivered a webinar on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Green Marketing, explaining how green marketing practices can contribute to achieving the United Nations 17 SDGs by 2030. Professor Thakur presented on how green marketing plays a crucial role in achieving SDGs and business transformation, explaining that companies must integrate environmental considerations across all four Ps (product, price, place, and promotion) of marketing. He discussed specific SDGs that green marketing directly supports, including affordable and clean energy (SDG 7), responsible consumption and production (SDG 12), and climate action (SDG 13), using examples from companies like Patagonia, Unilever, Starbucks, IKEA, and Nike to illustrate best practices. The session covered how green marketing communication is becoming increasingly important, with research showing strong consumer bias toward eco-friendly brands and 48% of consumers willing to change habits for environmental impact. Participants asked questions about implementing SDGs in Indian agricultural markets, policy coordination between central and state governments for solar initiatives, quality education challenges, and strategies for engaging students in sustainability efforts.

The webinar concluded with appreciation for Professor Thakur's presentation and a request for feedback to improve future events in the series. The session concluded with a discussion about implementing SDGs at school education levels and the importance of holistic participation from businesses, consumers, and governments to achieve sustainable development goals.

Manuscript Submission

CMDR Journal of Social Research (CMDRJSR) welcomes research papers for dissemination of original research, analytical papers, and papers based on literature review on any aspects of social sciences. Research papers should be submitted electronically to the Editor, CMDRJSR at editor@cmdr.ac.in.

Review System

Every research paper will be reviewed by masked reviewers. The Editor reserves the right to reject any manuscript as unsuitable for publication, keeping in view the required level of logical argument, the topic of relevance and citation style of the submitted paper without requesting for external review.

Basic Format of the Manuscript

Contributors must include their affiliations, and postal and e-mail address with their papers and recent book reviews. Research papers should be written in MS word (1.5 spaced) format ranging between 4000 to 5000 words. It must be accompanied by an abstract of 100 words and necessary keywords. CMDRJSR accepts reviews of scholarly books on social sciences (1500-2000 words).

Spellings and Numerical Usages

Use British spellings in all cases instead of American spellings (hence 'programme' not 'program', 'labour' not 'labor'). Use 's' spelling instead of 'z' spelling (hence 'organise' not 'organize'). Use figures to express all numbers 10 and above. Spell out numbers lower than 10, however for exact measurement, use only figures (3 km, 9 percent not%)

Quotation, Notes, Tables, and Figures

Use a single quote throughout. Double quotes are only to be used within single quotes. Spellings of words in quotations should not be changed. Quotations of 45 words or more should be indented from the text. CMDRJSR uses endnotes in the place of footnotes. Endnotes should be numbered serially and presented at the end of the paper. We advocate minimum usage of tables and figures. However, all the tables and figures should be numbered and their sources should be mentioned clearly below the tables and figures.

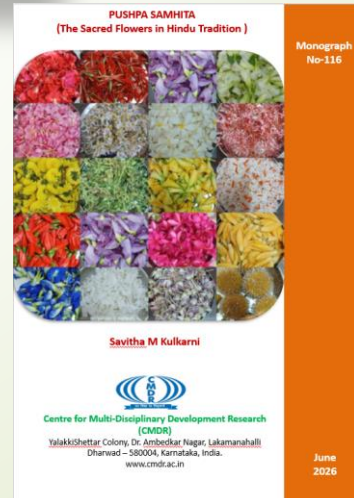
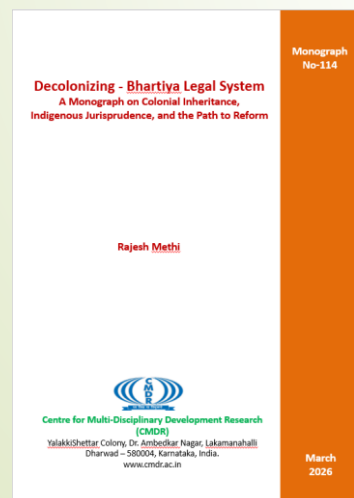
